## QBD CALLOVER - Actions listed for hearing w/c 23 November 2020

The Office of Lord Chief Justice has today announced that on **Friday 20 November**, Mr Justice Mc Farland will carry out a review of all **QB actions listed for trial w/c 23 November 2020** with a view to ascertaining readiness to proceed.

- The reviews will be scheduled **TODAY**, **20** November between **2.00** and 3.30 p.m.
- A list for the callover is attached.
- The callover will be conducted <u>Remotely</u> using Sightlink 52 Parties must <u>not</u> attend the court.
- Guidance on how to connect to Sightlink is available here .
- The Guidance for Civil Actions published on 23 September stipulated that parties must collaboratively complete the **HR1 Form** and lodge it with the Central Office (centraloffice@courtsni.gov.uk) no later than 14 days in advance of the hearing.

## **Adjournment Requests**

If the parties intend to vacate the hearing date and apply for an adjournment, a HR1
Form <u>must be</u> completed and filed for consideration by the Judge, and legal representatives will be expected to join the callover (via Sightlink) on 20 November 2020. This applies even if the adjournment is by consent.

Callovers will continue to be scheduled every Friday when all listed cases for the following week will be reviewed.
