# **Civil Justice Council's National Forum on Access to Justice 2022**

On **Friday 18<sup>th</sup> November, from 09:20 to 16.00**, the CJC is holding its 11<sup>th</sup> National Forum on access to justice.

The venue is Friends House 173-177 Euston Road London NW1 2BJ.

The CJC is promoting the National Forum as a unique opportunity to come together as a sector for discussion, challenge and knowledge sharing, combining the expertise and experience of the voluntary agencies, the pro bono agencies, court users, the judiciary, business, the Government, the professions, MOJ/HMCTS, the funding community, academic institutions, other charities, and more.

The Forum will focus on achieving successful outcomes, sustainability, and civil justice in its wider societal context. Sessions will cover accessibility, advice, anti-social behaviour, business, costs, digital justice, education and public understanding, determining mental capacity, resolving disputes before court, tenants & borrowers, vulnerability and more.

- To provide participants with the opportunity to actively contribute to change and improvement of our civil justice system alongside learning about innovative and best practice.
